



Here are a range of activities that Year 5 and 6 can be exploring during our Spring topic. Children should complete **at least one orange piece of homework** and **one blue piece of homework per week**. Homework books should be handed in on a Monday.

Writing

- Research and write an explanation text about why the battle was so important
- Write a diary entry from the perspective of a person on either side of the battle
- Write a newspaper article about the battle, perhaps from just before or just after it had ended.

Creative

- Design and create a new monument to commemorate the battle
- Create a piece of artwork, or sculpture which demonstrates the natural beauty of our local area

Maths

- Practise your multiplication and division facts first up to 12 and then continue to 20.
 - Y6 continue to revise all areas, particularly the arithmetic paper
 - Y5 practice adding/subtracting/multiplying fractions from last term

Active

- Collect items from the environment and create a nature sculpture
- Walk around your local community and sketch areas that bring your joy or that interest you
- Use a camera to photograph places that bring you joy. How could you add effects to the image? Please remember to ask permission if other people are in the image.

Community

Computing

- Have a go at creating a quiz about one of the topics we have studied this year. How could it be used to summarise the learning we have done?

Science

- Our science topic this term will be revisiting light from earlier in the year. How are shadows formed?
- How do our eyes see the objects that are in front of us?
 - How are rainbows formed?

History and Geography

- Research the Battle of Naseby and brush up on your knowledge of the events e.g. Why did the battle occur? Who was involved?
- Visit the battlefield and find out about the monument
