



Support for Dyslexia

Dyslexia is a learning disorder that affects reading ability. Children with dyslexia may have difficulty decoding words, spelling, and reading comprehension.

The following are strategies used by teachers in each classroom, to ensure all children are offered support with Dyslexia;

Staff are trained by a Dyslexia Specialist

Nurture support is offered

Use of 'Talk for writing' to help organise thoughts

Use of Laptops and iPads with appropriate software

Use of dyslexic font, that can be enlarged

Ensure the pupil fully understand by repeating the task or instruction and checking in with them.

Use of rehearsal and hooks to assist with memory

A range of Visualisation techniques are used

Classrooms are supported by a Teaching Assistant every day.

Colour overlays and reading rulers use to assist in reading and tracking words

Read aloud on laptops, to support with independent work

Teacher use coloured pens to make key words 'pop' out

Joy of reading is encouraged, the teacher will read to the pupils everyday, as well as the use of listening books
