Writing

- Research Anglo-Saxon stained glass window, and then have a go at creating you own design.

Speaking and Listening

 Listen to some Anglo-Saxon music, then talk about what you like and disliked about the music. Is there any similarities to music today?

Active

- Create your own war style dance (like the Haka) for the Anglo-Saxons.
- Anglo-Saxon loved racing, create your own race and have a go with some friends or family.
