Cromwell had spent the months leading up to the battle preparing his New Model Army.

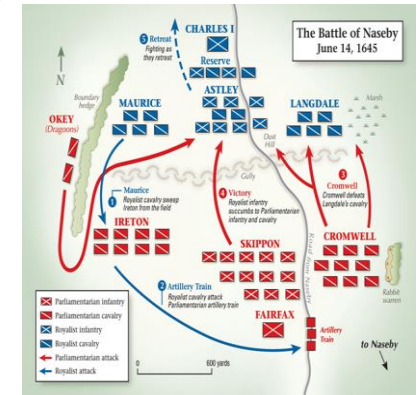
The 14,000 Roundhead soldiers took on the Cavalier force of around 9,000 men on the battlefield.
