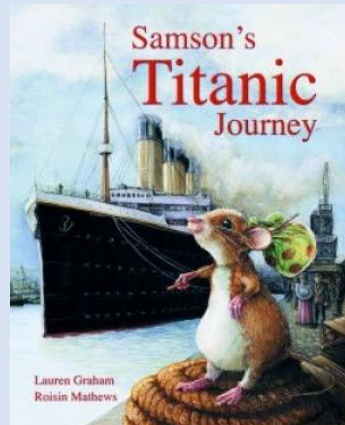
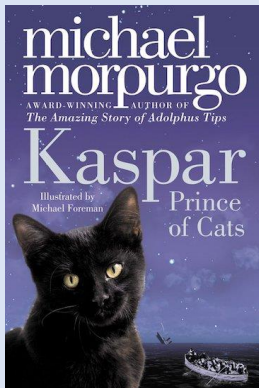
Those with more money had a better experience on board.

Lots of people helped out after the sinking to ensure that as many people as possible could be saved.



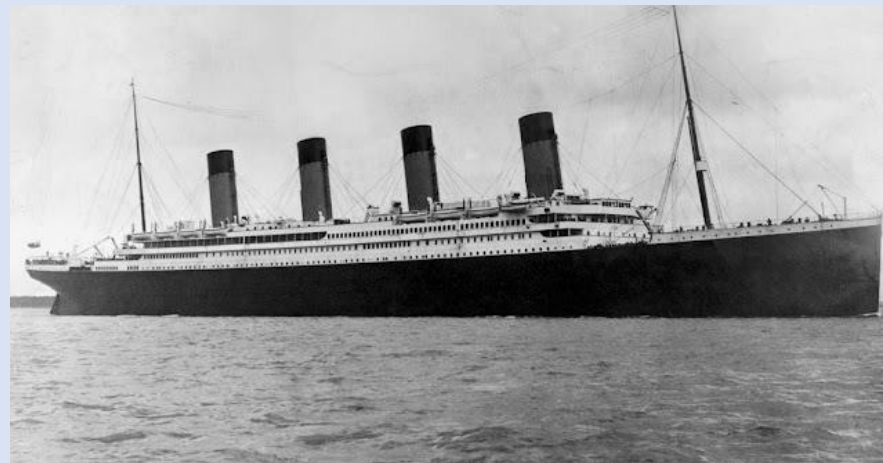

Key Vocabulary

Steamship: A ship powered by steam

Tragedy: An event causing great suffering, destruction and distress, such as a serious accident, crime or natural catastrophe.

Maiden voyage: The first voyage of a ship.

Wreck: Any building, structure, or thing reduced to a state of ruin.

Accommodation: A room, group of rooms, or building in which someone may live or stay.

Lifeboat: A specially constructed boat launched from land to rescue people in distress at sea.
