- Label an image of a soldier showing his uniform and weapon

- Create a tank using junk materials

Speaking and listening

- Ask a family member (or friend) about their experiences of the war
- Think of questions you might want to ask someone who fought in a war. Record yourself asking these questions.

- Visit a museum dedicated to the transport used in the wars, or a memorial such as The Imperial War Museum or the National Memorial Arboretum
- Visit key places involved in the wars such as Coventry Cathedral
- Go for a walk in your local area and write down all of the things you are grateful for
