



## Homework Grid

We ask all parents to read daily at home with your child for around 15 minutes. This can include their phonics book and hearing a bedtime story. We understand that often once your child get home from school, they are often tired and need to have some essential downtime. However, should your child want some additional work to explore after school or over the weekend, here are a range of activities that Fantastic Fox Cubs can choose to explore. Homework can be handed in to the teacher or submitted via Class Dojo. Evidence of completed homework may include written work, photos or artistic creations.

<b>Maths</b>  EYFS – Choose a number between 11 and 20. How many ways can you represent it?   Year 1 – Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.	<b>Science</b>  Make a poster showing the differences between autumn, winter, spring and summer. You could focus on the weather, the trees or the clothing we wear.	<b>Community</b>  Do a 'spring clean' - choose toys/clothes/games that you don't use anymore and donate them to charity.
<b>Active</b>  Take part in some relaxing yoga!  <a href="#">Cosmic Kids Yoga - YouTube</a>  Go for a walk and see if you can notice some signs of spring.	<b><u>The Battle of Naseby 1645</u></b>  	<b>History and Geography</b>  Create a simple map of Naseby, including a key.  Take some photos of interesting landmarks in Naseby and discuss them with a grown-up.
<b>Writing</b>  EYFS – Draw a picture of Naseby and write a sentence about it.  Year 1 – Write a fact file all about the village of Naseby.
