Fantastic Fox Cubs



The Fantastic Fox Cubs have had a wonderful start back at school in 2023 this term. They have thoroughly enjoyed our topic 'Let's Explore' and were very enthusiastic to learn about the seven continents and names of the worlds oceans. Our planning for this term was very much informed by the children's interests and areas of the earth that they wanted to explore and learn about. The main landscapes we focused on were the Arctic, under the sea, the jungle, and the desert. The children all contributed some wonderful vocabulary to create class poems about each area of exploration.

During maths lessons, year 1 consolidated their understanding of the place value of numbers to 20, before starting to work on addition and subtraction. The reception children looked at numbers 6,7, and 8, as well as doing work on length, mass and capacity. It was really lovely to see the children from both year groups taking an interest in what each other was learning and even opting to join in with some maths games and sessions together.

In Science, we have been exploring everyday materials. I was very impressed with the children's ability to name and identify the materials that everyday objects are made from. They had opportunities to partake in group investigations, testing materials to discover more about the properties of each.

The highlights from this term include the 'Cube competition' that the year 1 children took part in at Benham sports arena. Despite competing against older children, they rose to the challenge incredibly

well and were a real credit to the school. The class also enjoyed taking part in number day activities to raise money for the NSPCC.

We look forward to learning all about the work of some amazing artists in our new topic next term.

This term Wise Wolves have enjoyed learning all about the Shang Dynasty. We discovered the ways in which their society was organised, key figures in that period of time and the ways in which their society differs to ours. To link with this, we read 'The Willow Pattern Story' and wrote beautiful, emotive diary entries and designed our own blue and white pattern plate to tell a story.

In science, we enjoyed learning all about forces. We planned, carried out and evaluated an experiment showing the impact of air resistance. In RE we have learnt about how religions use the symbolism of 'light and dark' to represent 'good and bad' and how this used to support the worshippers of those religions.

We also enjoyed Bikeability this term, where we learned how to keep our bikes safe to ride and how to keep ourselves safe whilst riding on the roads.

We ended the term with creating 'I am' posters in PSHE with Mrs Linyard to celebrate the wonderful ways in which we are all unique.


