We have had a 'Super Science' week across the school this week. The highlight was a talk by Jez Morris from Mercedes AMG High Performance Powertrains. Jez fascinated the whole audience with information about some of the incredible things he has helped Mercedes to design from record breaking electric cars to life saving mini ventilators, which they were commissioned to design by University Hospital during they pandemic. The children thoroughly enjoyed passing around and looking at all the different parts he brought in to talk about and they had lots of fantastic questions! Having previous experience as a STEM ambassador, Jez knew exactly how to inspire a future generation about engineering. Jez enjoyed giving the talk & said; "It was my pleasure to speak to the children – they were so enthusiastic and polite. A truly amazing credit to you and the school. 'Brilliant Books' at Naseby C of E

Dear Parents/Carers,

We are excited to announce that we now have a new whole school Reading Scheme, kindly donated by the NSA. This collection of books will allow us to provide an appropriately levelled reading book for children from Years 2 – 6 to encourage fluency, expression and comprehension of the texts that they are reading.


Children in Reception and Year 1 will continue to have a Read, Write, Inc phonics and 'book bag' book, to support their reading. The children will still be encouraged to choose a book from the Library Bus to share at home, but the book that they are provided with from the scheme must come into school with the children every day and be read each evening at home. As you will know, we expect children to read aloud at home each evening for 5-10 minutes and we encourage this to be recorded in the children's reading records. This allows us to gain a clear picture of their progress and how we can better support their reading needs in school.

When we have assessed that your child can confidently read with fluency and expression from books at the top level of the scheme and are able to answer a range of questions about the books, they will be free to choose a book from either the reading bus and home to read instead. We look forward to hearing how much your children are enjoying their books! If you have any questions at all, please contact your child's class teacher, or myself on the school email addresses.
