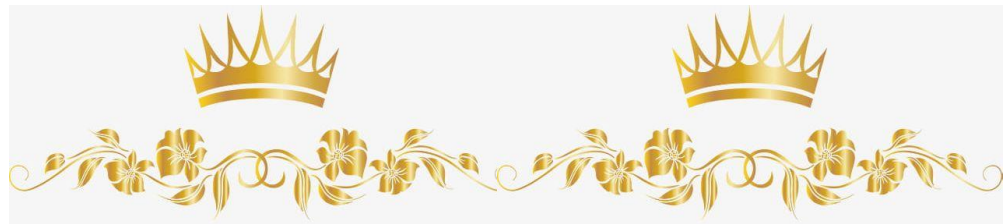


### Class 1



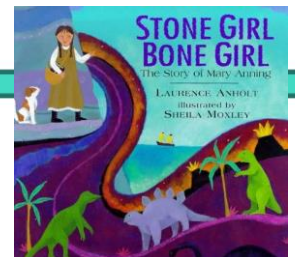
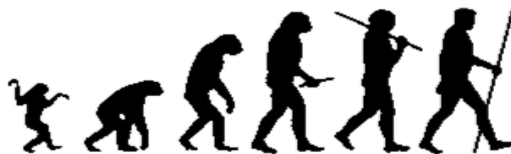

- ✓ Less hard footballs and more soft balls

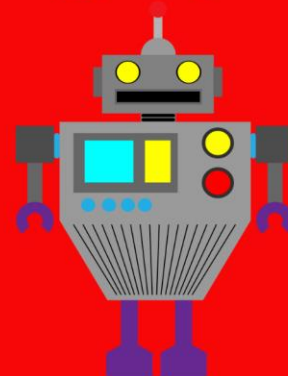
### Achievements;
