Class 2 have certainly been working hard again this week. In our literacy sessions we have started to read 'The Queen's Nose' by Dick King-Smith. The story is about a girl who is fortunate to enough to have seven wishes granted. As a result, we have had some very in-depth discussions about what the children would wish for themselves. The class agreed that wishing for friends and family to be happy would be their priority, and whilst lots of us would like more possessions and bigger homes, not everyone can have those things as it would cause deforestation and be bad for the environment. The class have also been calculating larger addition sums using column addition and recapping the work that they have done on our science topic 'Animals Including Humans'. In RE the children came up with their own modern version of the parable 'The Good Samaritan'. On top of this, we have also started to design and make our own bookmarks which will include some cross stitch. The class also thoroughly enjoyed the science assembly led by our visitor 'Atomic Tom'.
