This has also helped them with their science work where they have started to learn about the three natural types of rocks that are part of the rock cycle.


This week in Class 3, we have been learning all about factors and common factors in Maths (we even got to write on the tables!). We have also started our new history topic with a bang by brainstorming facts about ancient Egypt. After this, we looked for anachronisms (things that are out of place) in a piece of artwork about ancient Egypt (see if you can spot any in the image below). In science, we have started our new unit on healthy bodies by finding out about ideas of healthy eating in the past and how sailors were affected by scurvy.
