We were also lucky to have Canon Miranda and Father Kris lead one of this weeks' Collective Worship sessions about 'Peace', to fit with our theme of Remembrance.

The staff and children gathered on the playground on her last day to present her with a card, gift and bouquet of flowers to say 'Thank you' for all the care & support she has given the children during her time at Naseby. 

Reception have been exploring photos of themselves from past and discovering the ways in which they have changed. They have also had lots of fun with music and exploring making patterns using instruments.



Class 2










This week we have started to read 'The Dinosaur's Diary' by Julia Donaldson. We have been researching and discussing the habitats that different types of dinosaurs would have needed and the children have all started to develop designs for a model dinosaur habitat which they will make next week. In Science, we have continued to learn about the different types of rocks in the rock cycle. This week the class worked systematically to test the rocks, carefully observe, and group them according to their properties.



This week in Class 3, we have been learning all about prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers in Maths. We found Egypt on maps & located the Valley of Kings. We also focused on one of the British Museum's greatest treasures: the richly-decorated tomb of Nebamun, discovered in 1820 on the west bank of the Nile at Thebes. After this, we started looking at Ancient Egyptian tombs. We then started designing a tomb for an important Ancient Egyptian. In science, we have been looking in more detail at different food groups and exploring the importance of the food groups to the human body.



Last week, Class 1 wrote a poem about Poppies, for their topic 'Why do we wear Poppies?'


