In Busy Badgers class, the children's fascination about the experiences Mary Anning went through in her life, came through clearly in their enthusiastic explanations. They made excellent use of books and chrome books to support their investigations. 

Fantastic Fox Cubs

This week we have begun looking at narratives in literacy. We have been retelling Little Red Riding Hood and learning all about the structure of a narrative ready to write our own next week.

Reception have finished their unit on Little Red Hen and finished the week by making bread! Yum!

Fox Cubs have continued learning about their topic 'Why Do We Wear Poppies?' By reading Flo of the Somme and learning about animals in the war.

Busy Badgers

This week we have started to look at our geography topic 'Extreme Earth' which sits nicely alongside our work on rocks in science and our overall topic 'Dinosaurs'. We have been learning all about tectonic plates, earthquakes. tsunamis and volcanoes. The children have found learning about what is beneath their feet mind-blowing and it has sparked lots of interesting discussions about why people choose to live near volcanoes and what the continents might look like in years to come. The children have also created fact pages about the paleontologist Mary Anning. In music, children worked in small groups to create short performances portraying geological events or extreme types of weather. Finally in maths, the children have become very competitive at trying to recall their times tables and division facts quickly. We have been focusing on the 3-, 6-, and 4-times tables and will move on to look at the 8 times table and others next week.



Wise Wolves

This week, the Wise Wolves have been learning about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb. We turned the classroom into the tunnels of the tomb and uncovered artefacts. We discovered that a vast amount of what we know about ancient Egypt has been uncovered in the last 200 years, by archaeologists and Egyptologists like Howard Carter. In science, we created a 'lift the flap' human body and placed the heart, lungs, and sternum in the correct positions. In maths, we have been finding equivalent fractions, simplifying fractions using the highest common factor, and converting between improper fractions and mixed numbers.


