Busy Badgers have had a busy week with lots of different activities. In Maths they have been looking at fractions. In Literacy the class have been writing poems and letters to children at Yei Kindergarten in South Sudan who the school have supported over the years. They had their last recorder lesson with NMPAT on Thursday. The children have really enjoyed these recorder lessons over the last two terms with Mrs Carter and have done so well learning to play lots of tunes and singing songs.

In Science, the plants the children planted last week have now grown enough to start their experiment. They are observing and documenting daily what happens if each plant is either kept in the cold, not given water, not given any light or has its soil removed. The children also enjoyed dissecting a flower then finding and labelling different parts of a flower.

Wise Wolves



This week, the Wise Wolves have been creating information texts about their fictional creature. In history, we have been learning about how criminals were punished 800 years ago. This allowed us to find out about the types of crimes that were committed and how severe the punishments were. To prepare for Mothering Sunday, we made cards, paintings and poems to celebrate our mums.
